

Minutes Town Board Meeting

Community Center Gym

Tuesday Dec 8, 2020 7:00 pm

This is an abbreviated meeting due to the increase in Cov-id cases in Marinette County.

Chairman Matt Mattison called the meeting to order at 7.00 pm with Mattison, Supervisor Holmes, Supervisor Werner, Clerk Boshen, Treasurer Suzawith and thirteen community members present.

The pledge of allegiance was recited and Mattison opened the floor for public comments. Mark, Wisinski remarked that Ken and Rose Wallace are donating the Christmas wreaths for the cemetery fence again this year and that the Christmas Light decoration by Ken Mattison's house was not working.

Clerk Boshen read the minutes from the October 27th, November 10th and November 17th board meetings. Treasurer Suzawith reported that there is \$202,229.19 Gen mm, \$260,726.97 tax mm, \$9,248.70 checking, \$108,107.32 tonight's, vouchers,\$ 33,384.34 health savings account, and \$128,7510.80 in the equip cd. Supervisor Holmes made a motion to accept both reports as presented with the second made by Supervisor Werner. Unanimously approved.

On-Going/Continuing/New Business

According to Fred Smeester, chairman, there was no plan commission meeting in December.

Supervisor Holmes reported that the Wausaukee Rescue Squad is making progress with hiring and it looks like they will have enough staff to run the squad 24/7 by January. They are still actively recruiting qualified personnel. Some of the current members are also willing to continue working on a part-time basis as volunteers. Supervisor Holmes suggested that a board of directors with representatives from the municipalities involved will still have a say. He will get the word out to the board members on the status of the continuing efforts being made...

The Fire Department Report is on file in Clerk's office.

Supervisor Holmes reported that the grant for the new truck is coming along but the paperwork is onerous. He sent a whole packet of paperwork in last week and more information (balance sheet, town solvency, and posting of meeting in Jan before regular meeting) still needs to be sent in for approval. Chainman Mattison reported that gravel crushing has been completed and the conveyer has been moved out of Rosie's pit but not the rest of the equipment. Supervisor Holmes made a motion to purchase a lift for the shop for \$200.00 with a second by Supervisor Werner. The Town has only one road crew worker for last six weeks or so due to and injury and Covid. It is lucky we have not had to plow snow so far. If needed Scott Kemmerling will work as the backup plow driver until Verlyn Giguere can return to work.

Under new business Kim Nicolas and several other homeowners on Town Corner Lake near the Funky Chicken Campground have asked the town to enforce a noise ordinance, special events ordinance and permit, and zoning to protect their rights as property owners. They have stated that they can provide proof that the campground owners have not applied for proper permits and provided the Oct 23-25 example of the Funky Chicken Jamboree where seven bands played until midnight disrupting the peace. The Town Corner Lake residents asked that the Town modify/shore up the existing noise and special events ordinances/permits to protect surrounding Town of Amberg home

owners

Vouchers were paid and the meeting adjourned on a motion made by Supervisor Werner with the second by Supervisor Holmes at 7:50 pm.
